SOCIAL SERVICES

Catholic Charities, Diocese of Cleveland carries out Christ's healing mission here in Northeast Ohio. Catholic Charities delivers more than 150 services at 60 locations to over 400,000 individuals each year – providing help and creating hope for people of every race and religion throughout the eight counties in the Diocese of Cleveland (Ashland, Cuyahoga, Geauga, Lake, Lorain, Medina, Summit and Wayne).

Annually serves 3.2 million meals and provides 61,082 nights of shelter.

LEADERSHIP

The Most Rev. Daniel E. Thomas, Apostolic Administrator of the Diocese of Cleveland, named, Dec. 28, 2016 upon the retirement of Most Rev. Richard Lennon. Bishop Thomas was consecrated as Bishop of Toledo, Ohio in October 2014 and continues to serve in that episcopal capacity.

The Most Rev. Richard G Lennon (emeritus) consecrated as 10th Bishop of Cleveland on May 15, 2006. Ordained to the priesthood on May 19, 1973. Birth date is March 26, 1947 in Arlington, Massachusetts.

The Most Rev. Anthony M. Pilla, (emeritus) consecrated as Bishop of Cleveland on Jan. 6, 1981.

The Most Rev. Roger W. Gries, O.S.B. (Auxiliary Bishop emeritus) consecrated as Auxiliary Bishop of Cleveland on June 7, 2001.

CATHEDRAL

Cathedral of St. John the Evangelist was established 1848. It currently has a capacity of 1,200.
