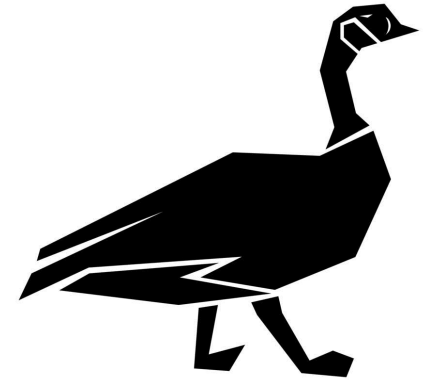

Ancient Celtic Christians had a name for the Holy Spirit: The Wild Goose. This retreat is an invitation into a more profound life-giving relationship with the Holy Spirit. This is a relationship marked by the love of God which breathes life into our daily existence. The Holy Spirit desires to be present to us in a manner that brings light out of darkness, freedom out of bondage, order out of chaos and life out of death. The dominant images of the Holy Spirit are a meek dove or a flickering flame of a candle, both of which are in one way accurate. But the Holy Spirit is more than that. God’s Spirit is power and blows not merely like a gentle breeze but at times like a raging wind. It’s hard to control a Wild Goose.

Prior to his retirement, Abbot Clement served as Abbot of Saint Andrew Abbey in Cleveland, Ohio for seven years. He now serves as the Chaplain-in-Residence of Loyola Retreat House in Clinton (City of Green), Ohio, which is in affiliation with the Benedictine Monks of Saint Andrew. He is also a Spiritual Director.

Abbot Clement earned his bachelor’s degree from St. John’s University in Minnesota and holds master’s degrees in Physics (University of Notre Dame), Religious Education (Loyola University) and Spirituality (Duquesne University). He studied under Fr. Adrian Van Kaam.

He was ordained in 1959, and shortly thereafter, joined the faculty of Cleveland Benedictine High School faculty where he taught physics and theology. While a teacher at Benedictine, he was a popular class moderator and served as Chaplain, as well as coach of the tennis and cross-country teams.

Father has been a novice master for twenty years and has been involved with retreats for students, lay adults and consecrated religious. He has also been a much sought-after Spiritual Director for many priests, religious and lay persons.

Abbot Clement translated the book, *“To My Priest,”* a book of confidences from our Lord
