DIRECTOR

FR. GERARD GONDA, OSB, M.ED.

Fr. Gerard, a Benedictine monk and priest, has been the President of Benedictine High School in Cleveland since 2008. He was born in Cleveland and attended St. Benedict Elementary School and Benedictine High School, graduating in 1971. He attended St. John University in Collegeville, Minnesota and John Carroll University where he received his B.A. in English in 1976. He entered the Benedictine order after his sophomore year in college and professed his monastic vows in 1974. He pursued theological studies at St. Mary Seminary in Cleveland and was ordained a priest in 1980 by Basil Cardinal Hume, OSB of Westminster, England.

Fr. Gerard joined the faculty of Benedictine High School after his ordination, teaching English and Theology. He earned a Master's Degree in Liturgical Studies from Notre Dame University, South Bend, Indiana in 1983 and a Master's Degree in Educational Administration from Bowling Green State University in 1990. At Benedictine High School, he served as Alumni Moderator, Student Council Moderator, and Academic Dean before being named Principal in June, 1999. He served as Principal until 2005 and was named President of the High School in 2008.

Fr. Gerard gives retreats and talks for parishes, student groups, and religious communities in the Diocese of Cleveland and other communities of religious sisters in New Jersey, Michigan, Tennessee, Wisconsin, Illinois, North Dakota, California and Ohio. For more than 30 years, he has assisted on weekends at Holy Trinity Parish in Avon, Ohio.
