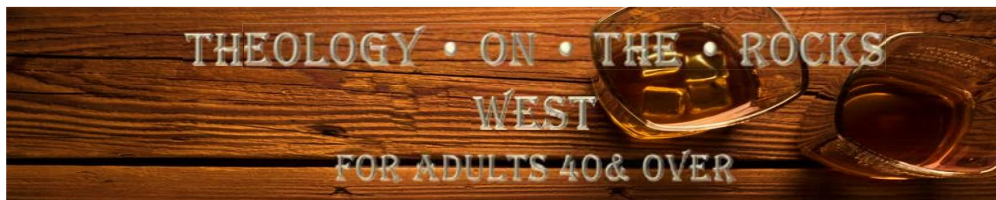

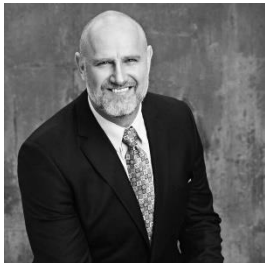

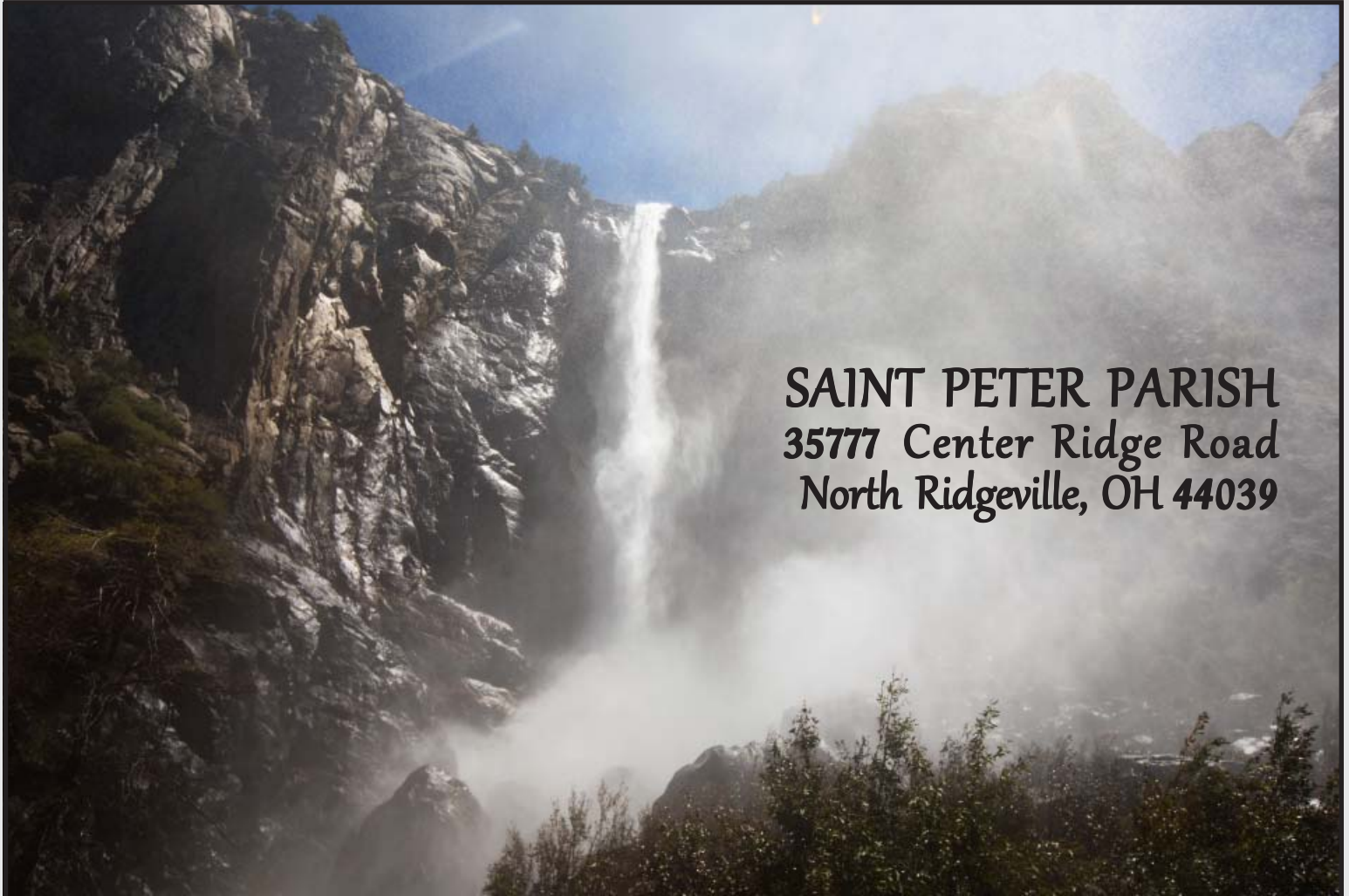

Larry Williams was named the Akron Zips Director of Athletics on August 18, 2015. Throughout his career, Larry has been a NCAA Division I athletics director, collegiate and professional athlete - including a stint with the Cleveland Browns, practicing attorney, media talent, university marketing administrator, and a top executive in the corporate trademark licensing and marketing industry.

During the three-year span under Larry, Akron Athletics programs performed at the highest level, ranking as three of the most successful years in University history. Larry also directed the athletics department at two universities (Marquette & Portland), focusing on competitive excellence, academic success, and business fundamentals.

Larry was a two-time All-American football player and a 1985 graduate of the University of Notre Dame. The offensive lineman played professional football in the NFL from 1985 to 1993, while at the same time earning a law degree from the University of San Diego School of Law in 1992. He then practiced law for the Indianapolis-based law firm of Baker & Daniels, before returning to Notre Dame in 1999 to work on licensing and product marketing.

A native of Santa Ana, Calif., Larry and his wife, Laura Lee Larry, have five children—Kristin, Sean, Scott, Eric, and Louis.

**CANDLEMAS DAY,
SATURDAY,
2 FEBRUARY 2019**

The Feast of the Presentation of the Lord (Candlemas Day) is one of only two liturgical celebrations which call for a procession of the faithful into church carrying lighted candles - the other being the Easter Vigil. The faithful gather outside the church (or for pastoral reasons, inside the church), and after their candles are lit, the priest blesses them:

"O God, source and origin of all light, ...sanctify with your blessing these candles, which we are eager to carry in praise of your name, so that, treading the path of virtue, we may reach that light which never fails."

The Procession follows. (RM, Proper of Saints, February 2)

**FEAST OF ST.
BLASE, SUNDAY,
3 FEBRUARY 2019,
BLESSING OF
THROATS**

"If the blessing [of throats] is conferred during Mass, the blessing follows the homily and general intercessions, or, for pastoral reasons, the prayer of blessing may take the place of the final blessing of the Mass. The blessing may be given by touching the throat of each person with two candles blessed on the feast of the Presentation of the Lord (February 2) and which have been joined together in the form of a cross.

If, for pastoral reasons, each individual cannot be blessed in the manner described in no. 1627, for example when great numbers are gathered for the blessing or when the memorial of Saint Blase occurs on a Sunday, a priest or deacon may give the blessing to all assembled by extending hands, without the crossed candles, over the people while saying the prayer of blessing. The blessing may also be given to the sick or the elderly in their homes when they cannot attend the parish celebration." (*Book of Blessings*, 1626-1629)

For Masses on Saturday, February 2 after 4:00 p.m., we suggest the Blessing of Throats may, at the pastor's discretion, take the place of the Final Blessing.

Please mark your calendars for the celebration of the Chrism Mass, Tuesday of Holy Week, April 16, 2019 at 7:00 p.m. At this special liturgy, Bishop Perez will consecrate all the holy oils which will be used in our diocese for the coming year. This is also an opportunity for priests of the diocese to renew themselves in their priestly vocation.

Please be advised that at this year's Chrism Mass, in an effort to be fair and non-partisan, parishioners will not have the opportunity to reserve seating for other parishioners in advance. General seating for the Chrism Mass will be first come, first served.

2019 EASTER VIGIL

"The Easter Vigil, in the holy night when the Lord rose again, is considered the "mother of all holy Vigils," in which the Church, keeping watch, awaits the Resurrection of Christ and celebrates it in the Sacraments. Therefore, the entire celebration of this sacred Vigil must take place at night, so that it both begins after nightfall and ends before the dawn on the Sunday." (*Universal Norms on the Liturgical Year and the Calendar*, third edition, # 21)

In the Catholic Diocese of Cleveland, the instruction "after nightfall" is to be interpreted as no earlier than 7:30 p.m.

**LOW-GLUTEN
HOSTS**

As many parishes are preparing for First Communion liturgies, it seems timely to review the Diocesan policy on Low-Gluten hosts.

Low-gluten hosts contain unleavened wheat and water and are free of additives, which conform to the requirements of the *Code of Canon Law* (canon 924, §2). This low gluten content is still enough to obtain the confection of bread for the Eucharist. Many gluten-intolerant persons may be able to consume it, or some portion of it. Such persons, are encouraged to review the gluten content for each specific product, and strongly advised to consult in advance with their physicians.

The common advice given to many Celiac and gluten-intolerant patients is to receive only the Precious Blood at Holy Communion. Additional concerns, however, can emerge when the Precious Blood has been “contaminated” with gluten at the commingling rite. The administration of the Precious Blood, whether under the form of wine or of mustum to persons with these conditions must carefully take into account the need to avoid any mixing of the sacred species at the altar or a communion station.

Low Gluten Hosts: Suggested Procedures

A person with gluten intolerance should keep a supply of low gluten hosts for use as needed. The parish could buy the hosts or the individual could buy hosts directly from one of the three approved suppliers listed above. (Recall that **only hosts from the suppliers listed above are valid matter for the Eucharist**. Low-gluten hosts from other suppliers or No-gluten/Gluten-free hosts are not valid matter for Eucharist.)

- A person with gluten intolerance should speak with the priest before Mass when providing a low gluten host.
- It is recommended that a person with gluten intolerance should use a small pyx in which to place the low gluten host to be consecrated. This will lessen the chance of this host getting mixed in with others.
- The pyx should be brought to the altar when the chalice, paten and other vessels are brought to set up the altar at the Preparation of the Gifts.
- The procedure for coming forward to receive Communion should be worked out with the pastor and/or liturgy staff of the parish.

Inquiry for Diaconate

The Diaconate Formation Office is accepting inquiries for men interested in the diaconate. To be considered, an applicant must be Roman Catholic at least 30 years of age (minimum age for ordination is 35), who is an active member of his parish with the support of his pastor. He must be in good health, of sound moral character, mature faith, regular practice in the sacramental life of the Church and have a sense of vocation to service. If married, he must be in a valid Catholic marriage for a minimum of five years, have the support of his wife and family and be in a strong, stable marriage. If unmarried, he must be willing and able to commit to celibacy. Although an upper age limit for application has not been established for the Cleveland diocese, the expectation is that ordained deacons will have the health and energy to provide a minimum of ten years of ordained ministry to the diocese of Cleveland.

The deadline for inquiries to our Diocesan Diaconate Aspirancy Program, which will begin in September 2019, is 1 March 2019. Registration Reminder

Registration for the spring semester is in process. Please be sure you have registered using the [Spring 2019 Online Registration](#) link that can be found on the seminary website under the "Students" menu in the top navigation. The last day to register without the additional \$25 late fee is January 4, 2019. Book lists will be available in the course room of your *Populi* profile around December 1st. **NOTE: ALL CHECKS MUST BE MADE PAYABLE TO SAINT MARY SEMINARY OR THEY WILL BE RETURNED TO YOU.**

Signing in at the Front Desk

Course Selection for Degree Program:

All MA students are expected to pursue the degree requirements in manner that they can complete the degree in no more than 8 years.

In the Spring '19 semester two MA CORE Courses are offered during the evenings: LIT 590ma Eucharist, and SC511ma Pentateuch. In addition, three electives and several other Scripture and Liturgy courses

are being offered. Students pursuing the MA degree are strongly encouraged to make every effort to take courses to advance their degree program. Course offerings were decided based on the number of MA students who needed these courses and who had the necessary pre-requisites. Please remember that some MA core courses are offered *in rotation* and may not be available in evenings for at least two semesters.

If you are close to graduation, please be strategic in your selection. If you would like to discuss your program, please contact me. Core courses and electives are scheduled on different evenings, so students should be able to take at least one course they need.

BIBLICAL STUDIES

SC 511ma

PENTATEUCH AND HISTORICAL BOOKS

3 credits

Sr. Lisa Marie Belz, OSU, PhD

Tuesday 6:45-9:35.m.

The course introduces students to both the Pentateuch (Genesis, Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers, and Deuteronomy) and the two Old Testament "histories," the so-called Deuteronomistic History (Joshua, Judges, 1-2 Samuel, and 1-2 Kings), and Chronicler's History (1-2 Chronicles, Ezra, and Nehemiah). These books will be treated with attention to their historical and cultural backgrounds as well as to their literary, theological, canonical, and contemporary dimensions. (**Pre-requisite:** SC 510 Biblical Hermeneutics;)

SC 512

PROPHETIC LITERATURE

2 credits

Sr. Lisa Marie Belz, OSU, PhD

Monday 9:40 – 11:30 a.m.

This course studies the canonical prophetic literature (except Daniel) considered within two contexts: ancient Jewish socio-religious history and the later Jewish and Christian appropriation of the tradition. The course will consider the phenomenon of prophecy, its literary expression, and the editorial/canonical history of these prophetic books. The course will focus on the major and minor prophets. Attention will be given to the themes, emphases, and major texts of each book. (**Pre-requisite:** SC 510 Biblical Hermeneutics)

SC 514

SYNOPTIC GOSPELS AND ACTS

3 credits

Rev. George Smiga, STD

Monday, 1:30 – 4:20 p.m.

This course serves as a special introduction to the Gospels of Mark, Luke, and Matthew. The course will explore the synoptic problem, redaction and form criticism, and the Gospels and history. The Apostolic Church and the Kerygma in the Acts of the Apostles will serve as a landscape for the course. Students will use selected passages of special doctrinal and liturgical import for exegesis. (**Pre-requisite:** SC 510 Biblical Hermeneutics) **Note:** SC 514 *Synoptic Gospels and Acts* is pre-requisite for TH 533 Christology. MA students who have not yet taken SC 514 are encouraged to do so, so that you are able to take TH 533 the next semester it is offered.)

SC 515

PAULINE LITERATURE AND CATHOLIC EPISTLES

2 credits

Rev. Mark Ott, STL

Monday: 1:30 – 3:20 p.m.

This course begins with an overview of Paul's background, encounter with Jesus, missionary activity, letter writing, and theological perspectives. The course continues with an in-depth examination of the undisputed letters of Paul with exegesis of select texts of doctrinal and liturgical import. This course includes an introduction and exegesis of selected passages of James, I and II Peter, Jude and Hebrews (**Pre-requisite:** SC 510 Biblical Hermeneutics)

SC 513

PSALMS AND WISDOM

2 credits

Sr. Lisa Marie Belz, OSU, PhD

Thursday 1:30 – 3:20 p.m.

This course will first examine the formation, use, and significance of the book of Psalms. A number of individual psalms will then be studied, with special attention not only to their literary genre but also to their poetic design, location within the Psalter, theological value, and reinterpretation in Israel and in the Christian Church. Attention will next turn to the Wisdom literature (Proverbs, Job, Qohelet, Sirach, Wisdom, and the Song of Songs) for a consideration of their origin, literary structure, and theological significance. (**Pre-requisite:** SC 510 Biblical Hermeneutics;)

SC 556

THE GOSPEL OF LUKE

2 credits

Rev. Mark Ott, STL

Tuesday 6:45 – 8:35 p.m.

This study of the third Gospel begins with an introduction to the scholarly debate about its origin, purpose, and theology. The course continues with a systematic reading of the gospel. Attention is given to Lucan themes in the light of the Book of the Acts of the Apostles. In addition the course will include applications to teaching and preaching the Gospel of Luke in Cycle C. **(Pre-requisite: SC 510: Biblical Hermeneutics)**



PASTORAL THEOLOGY

PAS 561

CANON LAW II

3 credits

Rev. Gary D. Yanus, J. C. D

Thursday, 1:30 – 4:20 p.m.

Study of Book IV and the canons regarding penance and anointing, holy orders, and special emphasis on marriage are treated in this course. Pastoral care, preparation and celebration of marriage, plus canonical grounds for nullity and dissolution will be discussed. The student will be introduced to the practical handling of cases and procedures when dealing with the diocesan chancery or tribunal. The course will provide students with the necessary canonical knowledge regarding preparation and celebration of the sacraments and other acts of divine worship. **(Pre-requisite: PAS 360 Canon Law I)**



LITURGICAL & SACRAMENTAL THEOLOGY

LIT 560

LITURGICAL AND SACRAMENTAL THEOLOGY

3 credits

Rev. Michael G. Woost, S.T.L.

Monday 8:40 – 11:30 a.m.

This course serves as a theological introduction to the liturgical and sacramental life of the Roman Catholic Church. The course will consider the symbolic nature of liturgy, the sacramental principle and its importance in the form of faith celebrations. Critical reflection on liturgical practices will be linked to the liturgical tradition and Christian spirituality. Underlying commonalities of the sacraments will be considered.

LIT 584

LITURGY AND THE ART OF RITUAL

2 credits

Edward Kaczuk, Ph.D

Wednesday 9:00-10:50 a.m.

This course offers a holistic approach to celebrating the Rites of the Catholic Church in a manner faithful to its Tradition and in service to the common spiritual good of its faith communities. Emphasis is given to preparing for parochial liturgies, the roles of parish liturgical music and art, liturgical ministries, liturgical law, and pastoral issues.

LIT 590ma (MA Core*)

EUCCHARIST

3 Credits

Rev. Scott Detisch, Ph.D.

Wednesday, 6:45-9:35 p.m.

This course is a study of the Eucharist as the center and focus of the Christian community and personal Christian life. Examined are the testimonies of the Scriptures, the Fathers, Church Councils, and modern theologians. The issues of the reformers are raised along with present ecumenical concerns. The various presences of Jesus and their implications are noted. **(Prerequisite: LIT 560)**

LIT 630/930

SACRAMENTS AND THE CHRISTIAN MYSTICAL TRADITION

2 credits

Rev. Michael G. Woost, S.T.L.

Wednesday 3:35 – 5:25 p.m.

By examining the lives, contributions, and writings of a representative group of Christian mystics, this course will explore the ecclesial, ministerial, and incarnational dimensions of the Christian mystical tradition through the lens of the Church's liturgical-sacramental tradition. **(Prerequisite: LIT 560)**



SYSTEMATIC THEOLOGY

TH 550

MARY AND THE SAINTS

2 credits

Sr. Mary McCormick, OSU, Ph.D.

Friday, 9:40 – 11:30 a.m.

This course will explore Mary's role within the Church as first among the saints. It includes a brief review of the person of Mary and the saints throughout the history of this tradition. Emphasis will be given to contemporary theological reflection on the place of Mary and the communion of saints within the Church's doctrine. **(Pre-requisite: TH 530 Fundamental Theology)**



HISTORICAL STUDIES

HIS 524

CHURCH HISTORY II

3 credits

Rev. John E. Manning, D.Min.

Wednesday 1:30 – 4:20 p.m.

This course surveys Church history from 1300 C.E. to the present time. Among topics treated in detail are: Avignon Papacy, the Western Schism, Conciliarism, the Protestant Reformation, the Catholic Reform, Jansenism, the Church and Liberalism, Vatican Council I, Modernism, and Vatican Council II. Particular emphasis will be placed on important trends and ideas underlining these events and movements.

HIS 543

COUNTER-REFORMATION AND CATHOLIC ENLIGHTENMENT

2 credits

Wm. Christopher Hoag, D.Min.

Monday 6:45-8:35 p.m.

This course will examine the growth and transformation of the Church from the Council of Trent until the French Revolution. The course will include such themes as: the response of the Church to the challenge of Protestantism, the growth of Catholic religious orders, the missionary activity of the Church, Gallicanism and Jansenism in France and Italy, Febronianism and Josephinism in Germany and Austria, Penal Times in Britain, and the rise of Rationalism and Secularism. Students will be come to understand the challenges faced by the Church as she confronted early Modernity and how these influenced the development of the contemporary Church.

HIS 522ma

CHURCH HISTORY I

3 credits

Wm. Christopher Hoag, D.Min.

Dates and Times TBA May – June

This course surveys the Church's growth and development from sub-apostolic times to the year 1000 C.E. The course will examine the Patristic Age through readings from the Apostolic Fathers, the Apologists, and the theologians of the third and fourth centuries. Special focus will be given to the Golden Age of the Church Fathers and to the major councils of the Church in that period. Developments, trends, and events of medieval times will be discussed, including the papacy, monasticism, the formation of Europe, the Dark Ages, relationships between Eastern and Western expressions of Christianity and Islam.

TH 545ma

GOD: ONE AND THREE

2 credits

Sister Mary McCormick, OSU, PhD

Dates and Times TBA May – June

This systematic study of the doctrine of the Trinity will explore the biblical, historical, and magisterial foundations of the nature of God as defined amid the early Christological controversies and councils. Current developments in Trinitarian theology will be handled in light of modern understandings of language, methodology, symbols and faith experience
