



Dear Catholic School Teachers, Parish Catechist, Parish Employees, Employees of Catholic Agencies,

It is with immense pleasure that I write to inform you about a new initiative at Ursuline College. The Educational Administration and Theology and Pastoral Studies departments are offering special scholarships to Catholic school teachers, parish catechist, parish employees and employees of Catholic agencies who wish to pursue a master's degree in Educational Administration, a principal's or superintendent's license, or a master's degree in Theology and Pastoral Studies.

The National Catholic Education Association (NCEA) has published a report encouraging Diocesan school officials to develop succession plans so that personnel are available to assume leadership roles at individual schools and Diocesan offices as vacancies occur. The Ursuline College initiative has been shared with the Diocese of Cleveland Superintendent and Associate Superintendent. They are supportive of our initiative.

Currently Ursuline graduates serve as principals in more than 50% of the Diocesan elementary schools. Ursuline graduates also serve as administrators in 13 Diocesan high schools. We want to continue to do our part to prepare administrators for Catholic schools. The Educational Administration and Theology and Pastoral Studies programs already have a 40% cost reduction from the graduate tuition. In addition, Catholic agency employees will receive the following reductions:

- For each of the first five course taken in a program, the individual would receive \$300.00 off each course.
- For courses 6-10 taken in a program, an individual would receive \$400.00 off each course.
- For courses 11-15 taken in the program, an individual would receive \$500.00 off each course.

Please post and/or distribute the attached flyer to all appropriate people. Also, please encourage individuals you see as leaders to begin to walk this path. It is important that our future Catholic leaders receive their training from a place that honors Catholic School Education and that prepares individuals for employment in Catholic agencies.

Ursuline is ready to enroll individuals for the summer semester that begins May 13.


