Family Ritual for the Saint Joseph's Table Blessing

Book of Blessings 1679-1700

1679 On the solemnity of Saint Joseph (March 19) it is the custom in some places to bless bread, pastries, and other food and give a large portion of it to the poor.

1680 The faithful should be encouraged to participate in the celebration of Mass on the solemnity of Saint Joseph.

1681 These orders may be used by a priest or a deacon, and also by a layperson, who follows the rites and prayers designated for a lay minister.

INTRODUCTORY RITES

1682 When the community has gathered, a suitable song may be sung. After the singing, the minister says:

In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

All make the sign of the cross and reply: Amen.

1684 A lay minister greets those present in the following words:

Praised be God, who gives us saints as models and examples.

Blessed be God for ever.

R. Blessed be God for ever.

1685 In the following or similar words, the minister prepares those present for the blessing. Today we honor the memory of Saint Joseph, husband of the Virgin Mary and patron of the universal Church. We rejoice at this table, which is a sign of God's generous blessings and of our call to serve the poor and hungry. We pray that through the intercession of Saint Joseph we too might join the saints at the banquet of the Lord in the heavenly kingdom.

READING OF THE WORD OF GOD

1686 A reader, another person present, or the minister reads a text of sacred Scripture.

Brothers and sisters, listen to the words of the holy gospel according to Matthew:

1:18-23 Joseph did as the angel commanded him.

Now this is how the birth of Jesus Christ came about. When his mother Mary was betrothed to Joseph, but before they lived together, she was found with child through the holy Spirit. Joseph her husband, since he was a righteous man, yet unwilling to expose her to shame, decided to divorce her quietly. Such was his intention when, behold, the angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, "Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary your wife into your home. For it is through the holy Spirit that this child has been conceived in her. She will bear a son and you are to name him Jesus, because he will save his people from their sins." All this took place to fulfill what the Lord had said through the prophet:

"Behold, the virgin shall be with child and bear a son, and they shall name him Emmanuel," which means "God is with us."

1688 As circumstances suggest, the following responsorial psalm may be sung, or some other suitable song.

Psalm 89

R. The Son of David will live forever.

The favors of the LORD I will sing forever; through all generations my mouth shall proclaim your faithfulness. **R. The Son of David will live forever.**

For you have said, "My kindness is established forever"; in heaven you have confirmed your faithfulness: "I have made a covenant with my chosen one. I have sworn to David my servant:

R. The Son of David will live forever.

"Forever will I confirm your posterity and establish your throne for all generations."

R. The Son of David will live forever.

The heavens proclaim your wonders, O LORD, and your faithfulness, in the assembly of the holy ones. For who in the skies can rank with the LORD? Who is like the LORD among the sons of God?

R. The Son of David will live forever.

1689 As circumstances suggest, the minister may give those present a brief explanation of the biblical text, so that they may understand through faith the meaning of the celebration.

INTERCESSIONS

1690 The intercessions are then said, or the Litany of Saint Joseph may take the place of the intercessions. The minister introduces them and an assisting minister or one of those present announces the intentions. From the following those best suited to the occasion may be used or adapted, or other intentions that apply to the particular circumstances may be composed.

The minister says: Let us call upon the name of the Lord through the intercession of Saint Joseph with the words:

R. Lord, you are our hope and our strength.

Assisting minister: That we who have listened to the word of God may do his will, let us pray to the Lord.

R. Lord, you are our hope and our strength.

Assisting minister: That we who have experienced doubt and fear may be helped in times of difficulty, let us pray to the Lord.

R. Lord, you are our hope and our strength.

Assisting minister: That we may hunger for justice and mercy, we pray to the Lord.

R. Lord, you are our hope and our strength.

Assisting minister: That we who seek God's way may complete our journey to God's kingdom, let us pray to the Lord.

R. Lord, you are our hope and our strength.

Assisting minister: That we who follow the example of Saint Joseph, patron of the universal Church, may strive always to build up the body of Christ, let us pray to the Lord.

R. Lord, you are our hope and our strength.

1692 After the intercessions or litany the minister, in the following or similar words, invites all present to sing or say the Lord's Prayer.

Let us pray to the Father in the words our Savior gave us: All: Our Father . . .

PRAYER OF BLESSING

1693 A lay minister says the following prayer with hands joined.

All-provident God, the good things that grace this table remind us of your many good gifts.

Bless this food, and may the prayers of Saint Joseph, who provided bread for your Son and food for the poor, sustain us and all our brothers and sisters on our journey towards your heavenly kingdom.

We ask this through Christ our Lord.

R. Amen.

CONCLUDING RITE

1695 A lay minister concludes the rite by signing himself or herself with the sign of the cross and saying: May almighty God, the Father, and the Son, and the Holy Spirit, bless and protect us. R. Amen.

1696 It is preferable to end the celebration with a suitable song.
